Step 2: Click the link in the e-mail to read the day's news article.  
Step 3: Do the activity.  
Step 4 Finish the thought question.  
Step 5: Vote in the poll.

4. On the next page you will see information about the Home Edition of the program. On this page there is a link that says 'Click Here to sign up'. Please click 'click here'
5. A pop-up will appear asking for information about you/your child. Once you fill in the required fields, click 'Submit' and your request will be sent to Achieve3000's Customer Support Department. They will create your parent account and email you the login credentials for your account.
