






The Wharton Borough School District is a "Choice" district serving approximately 700 students in two schools. The district has a PreK - 5 grade elementary school, with full-day Kindergarten, and one middle school, housing grades 6-8.



Wharton was originally incorporated as the borough of Port Oram by an act of a New Jersey Legislator on June 26, 1895, created from portions of Randolph Township and Rockaway Township.

The name was changed to Wharton on April 16, 1902. The borough was named for Joseph Wharton of Wharton Steel Company in 1902. Wharton also endowed the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania.



# Session 1 - Strengths and Challenges/Opportunities of the Wharton Borough Public Schools, and a Shared Vision for the District Five Years from Now

On December 14, 2022 Wharton Borough administrators, staff, Board members, parents, community members, and students came together to initiate strategic planning. The first evening's topics focused on the strengths and challenges/opportunities of the Wharton Borough Public Schools to help inform the question of where the district is now and to envision an ideal future five years from now.

The Wharton Borough Board of Education opened the meeting. Christopher Herdman, Superintendent, provided an informative overview of the district. Charlene Peterson, from New Jersey School Boards Association, introduced the strategic planning process and assisted throughout the small and large group work.

The participants gathered into three mixed stakeholder groups to brainstorm the strengths and challenges/opportunities of the Wharton Borough Public Schools. The groups were also asked to pretend it is the year 2028 and they were giving a speech to all the top educators in the state to share the visionary reasons why the district was being awarded as the top district for advancing student achievement. They were asked to provide a title for the speech and to identify what was taking place in the district that caused this remarkable success. The student participants rotated among the three groups to share their unique insights.

After discussion, each group came to a consensus on their top strengths, challenges/opportunities, and five-year visionary ideas and presented those to the full group of meeting participants.

# **Developing a Broad Goal Statement and Supporting Objectives for Each Goal Area**

On March 23, 2023 Wharton Borough parents, board members, staff, administration, and community members came together to continue the strategic planning process. This meeting focused on the development of a broad goal statement and four or so supporting objectives for each of the goal areas. These goals will represent a shared vision for the Wharton Borough Public Schools over the next five years.

The Board opened its public meeting and then turned it over to Charlene Peterson from New Jersey School Boards Association to facilitate the strategic planning process. The group was provided with an overview of the December 14, 2022 meeting outcomes and then the goal writing process was introduced that included the connection to the work from the first meeting, the survey results, and the components of a goal statement.

Participants were divided into three breakout groups – one group per each goal area:

- Operations
- Culture, Climate, & Communication

Each goal area group was tasked with writing a broad goal statement and developing accompanying objectives that reflected the strengths, challenges, and visions relative to their goal area as determined in the December meeting and the survey results.


